The socio-political reformer Ambedkar's legacy has a significant impact on contemporary India. His socio-political ideas were acknowledged throughout the political spectrum in India after independence. His academic standing earned him the positions of first law minister of independent India and chairman of the committee that wrote the constitution. Dr B. R. Ambedkar also known as **Babasaheb** was born in a *Dalit* family in the year 1891. He served as the chairman of the drafting committee for the constitution making. His philosophy was unique because he visualised an approach through a complex web of mystical and fantastical ideas as well as the Hindu scriptures' views, which predominated in India. His views promoted rationalism and the liberty of Man; he resented the idea of an Almighty Power, the enlightened spiritual individualism of the Hindu scriptures, the indefinite existence of the soul, and transmigration.
