The term domestic violence implies the incidence of familiar or intimate battering having reference to an idealized family unit functioning in a protected and secluded manner, appropriately shielding from the public.² This idealized conception, the rhetoric of inviolability of family as an institution, has shielded domestic violence behind an iron curtain as an unacknowledged phenomenon behind the "closed door" of the family, a private matter between "inmates", which is neither a concern of public scrutiny nor of interventions.3

What is domestic violence? Domestic violence manifests as verbal, physical or psychological abuse, often in the forms that are more subtle than the violence elsewhere
