## Introduction

The current status of Census data 2011 has made a startling revelation about the declining Child Sex Ratio between 0-6 years with an all time low of 919.Despite the considerable economic growth in the last decades India could not translate this growth into improving gender indicators. This decline in the CSR is a major indicator of women disempowerment as it begins before birth. This disempowerment manifests in gender biased sex selection and elimination and continues in various forms of discrimination towards girls after birth. Whether in fulfilling her health needs, nutrition, educational needs.

The availability of medical diagnostic tools has made the practice of sex selective elimination of female fetus easy. This has been a major influence of the skewed sex ratio. The socio-cultural and religious biases, preferences for sons have twisted the attitude of the society towards girls.
