Mediation Centre at the High Court level is working under the committee comprises of High Court judges and first puisine judge is being the chairman and patron of the committee is chief justice of the respective High Court. Now the High Court is working at a very gross root level in organizing awareness programe, mediation training programe, judges training programe. Delhi High Court has played a very pivotal role in justice delivery system through incorporating and implementing new techniques .Delhi High Court strategically situated at a place where High court can abreast easily with any policy making . In Delhi Patiala House Court being the District Court has establish its own mediation Centre. Mediation Centre is playing important role in resolving the dispute. In the present research paper I am going to discuss how the Patiala house mediation Centre is functioning, what kind of cases comes for the mediation at Patiala House ,how is the efficiency of the mediation.
